Christians working and praying for a nuclear weapons-free world

Church of England Synod vote on nuclear weapons

The Church of England called on UK to 'respond positively to the UN Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons by reiterating publicly its obligations under Article VI of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty and its strategy for meeting them...'

The debate was on 8 July at Church of England General Synod, York, on 'Ethics of Nuclear Weapons'

Stephen Cottrell, Bishop of Chelmsford opened the debate saying, 'According to 'Just War' theory there are no circumstances in which Nuclear weapons could be used, yet they exist, and could be used.' We are not telling our government what to do, we are asking them to stop telling us what they will not do and work towards developing plans that will rid the world of the danger and expense of nuclear weapons.' He quoted Pope Francis, 'Their possession is as bad as their use.' The motion calls on the UK government to 'respond positively' to the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW), (the Ban Treaty negotiated by 122 nations at the United Nations, New York July 7 2017, now one year old.

The debate was then interrupted by a call for a move to 'next business' (winter care for the homeless). This was decisively defeated.

The debate ranged widely from serving and retired armed forces personnel to wholehearted support for the motion. Bishop Stephen concluded the debate with St Francis 'First do what is necessary, then do what is possible and

CCND fringe meeting at Synod

Sean Doherty sponsored CCND for a fringe meeting on 7th July. The meeting entailed a lunchtime celebration of the UN Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear weapons. Elizabeth Minor (ICAN UK) answered questions about the TPNW.

The Treaty arose from concerns over the catastrophic humanitarian consequences of nuclear weapons.

She brought a replica of the Nobel Peace Prize awarded to the International Campaign for the Abolition of Nuclear Weapons for its achievement of the UN Treaty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons and 'its exemplary work with Civil Society.'

Synod voted by counted vote 260 for, 26 against, 21 abstained.

CCND is delighted that the General Synod has passed this motion. The Church of England has joined all the other churches in the UK calling on the government to respond positively to the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons.

We thank all those involved in the debate for their work in making this happen. This will strengthen all, as in our strapline 'working and praying for a nuclear weapons free world world wide'.

Our grateful thanks to all members who wrote letters, prayed, or worked in other ways to help get this wonderful result.
